New people coming always means people leaving, and our friendship and sense of justice requires thanking those who leave the Board after an important, extraordinary services provided to AIMS: Those are Carlos Moya (Vice-president since 2005) who becomes Honorary Vice-president; Gordon Rogers after 20 years of service as Technical Director; and Carlo Capalbo, what to say about after having attended this Congress hosted by him and his team.

In summary, it is our hope that you have enjoyed your participation in this  $19^{th}$  AIMS World Congress, hoping to see all of you and hopefully many more people in 2014 at the  $20^{th}$  AIMS World Congress in Durban, South Africa.
